Highlights of the 82nd Regular Legislative Session

- Architects and Engineers: House Bill 2284 by Hardcastle passed during the regular session and is intended to solve the overlap issues between architects and engineers. The bill clarifies activities that are engineering and architecture and creates a grandfathering provision for engineers that meet certain requirements. TBPE is working with the Board of Architectural Examiners (TBAE) on implementation and will be communicating new information as it develops. - **Sunset Review of TBPE:** The Sunset date for the agency has been moved from 2015 to 2013. The Sunset Advisory Commission reviews specific agencies and programs and determines whether they are still fulfilling a public need or whether the agency should be abolished. TBPE will be working hard over the next two years to communicate how the agency protects the health, safety, and welfare of the public, the importance of professional engineering in Texas, and the innovations and important work of the agency.

The proposed rules will be considered for adoption at the next TBPE board meeting August 18, 2011.
